Greetings in Christ!

We had a great Wisdom Weekend! (see summary in this newsletter). We learned that we are one of the friendliest churches that the Secret Visitor agency has ever rated! We learned also that we have some work to do in specific areas: staff alignment, vision statement, communication, track to discipleship. What a blessing to have five excellent consultants give literally days to understand us and make prescriptions for us! Truly it was a gift of the annual conference to us and to our future.

As we prepare to vote on February the 19th for going forward with these prescriptions, I think it is important to note the following:

1. They were sent to us by God, for our good. They came to help us be the best United Methodist Temple on the Southside of Terre Haute that we can be.

2. A yes vote by our church will give us a clear mission statement: **To make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.** From this we will develop our vision, goals, and objectives. Here are a few examples of vision state-

ments: *“Inviting everyday people to experience Christ in everyway.”* *“Guiding self-reliant people toward a Christ-centered lifestyle.”* *“Loving people back to life.”*

“Encouraging more life in Christ, one life at a time.” *“To invite people into God’s larger story as we follow Christ together.”* *“Connecting people each day to the real Jesus in a real way.”*

3. A track to discipleship.

From clarity about our mission (see 2), and a statement of vision (still to be developed and adopted), we evaluate our ministries, and develop a track to discipleship. All of this to bring us into congruence, or alignment with each other.

4. What is the financial commitment if we say yes?

To provide a coach for Pastor Steve for implementation, there will be a cost of \$200 a month for 18 months. (We have already in hand an anonymous gift of \$20,000 for implementation of the prescriptions, should we say yes.) So we have the money.

5. The creation of a communications strategy: From my perspective, this last is one of our biggest

needs. We are a great church, with great music, and great experiences of worship, but we aren’t known at all for this. We must do a better job of marketing and promoting what we do.

As your pastor, I’m excited! I hope you are! I believe that we are starting an important journey for Christ!

Our very own Miss Hazel Perry is the mentor of Bryce, a precocious (and oft times impetuous and rowdy!) third grader. He has been in trouble too often in the two previous years he has been at Farrington Grove. That is until he met Miss Hazel! Suddenly this child is agreeable, much more responsible and responsive in class, loves to come to school, and is rarely in the

principal's office. As the office staff says over and over again, "Bryce is a different little boy since he started seeing Miss Hazel. She means the world to him and he has turned around one hundred percent!"

Wouldn't it be great if every child had someone that could help turn their lives around? That someone could easily be YOU! We have lost several children in the last month to the transience of poverty. Many times a

family is unable to pay rent, so they must find a new place to live, and that place is not always in the same school district. But there is always a long list of children waiting for a mentor. We are down to 17 mentors!! Won't you please help for one hour per week? It takes so little time to help so much! 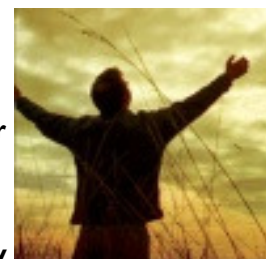
We may feel despair, wondering if there is any way out of our circumstances. Maybe our plight is impossible, at least without God's help, but faith can make even the impossible happen.

SUMMARY OF FRUITFUL CONGREGATION JOURNEY SIX PAGE CONSULTATION REPORT

The following is a summary of the key points of the 6 page report presented by the Consultation Team. If you would like a copy of the full report, it is available in the church office or you may call the office and request one.

Strengths

United Methodist Temple's greatest strengths are :

1. **PRAYING FOR EACH OTHER:** Everyone in the congregation affirmed the email prayer ministry, started by Reverend Gene Gilbreath that enables people to connect and care for one another spiritually.
2. **IDENTIFYING AND WELCOMING NEWCOMERS:** We learned from the Mystery Worshipers Report that the church does a great job of recognizing and welcoming newcomers to both worship services.
3. **PASSION TO REACH YOUNG FAMILIES:** The interviews and focus groups, without exception, expressed a passion to reach young families. The congregation recognizes that ministries to children, youth and young parents are needed; and are energetic about moving in that direction.
4. **CARING FOR EACH OTHER:** When the church discovers a need within the congregation, they enthusiastically mobilize to respond and effectively provide assistance.
5. **LOCATION AND FACILITIES:** The church is extremely visible because of its location on the south side of Terre Haute along well-traveled US Highway 41. The proximity to multiple retail outlets means thousands of people pass within 100 feet of the church every day.

Concerns

United Methodist Temple's greatest areas of concern are :

1. **LACK OF SHARED VISION:** There is no clear stated vision that defines how the church accomplishes its mission to make disciples and transform the world.
2. **DYSFUNCTION IN STAFF COMMUNICATION AND CLARIFICATION OF ROLES:** There have been numerous pastoral appointments over the last several years. Each pastor brought his own unique leadership style. This has created a lack of clarity in staffing needs/roles.
3. **LIMITED OUTWARD FOCUS:** There is little purposeful or intentional corporate outreach methodology that identifies and responds to the physical and spiritual needs of people outside the church
4. **INADEQUATE COMMUNICATION AND CONNECTION:** The church does not adequately communicate and make connections with those inside and outside the church.
5. **NO CLEAR DISCIPLESHIP PATHWAY:** It is the finding of the consult team that no one could articulate a discipleship pathway at United Methodist Temple.

PRESCRIPTIONS

In order to address the above concerns, United Methodist Temple must implement the following prescriptions:

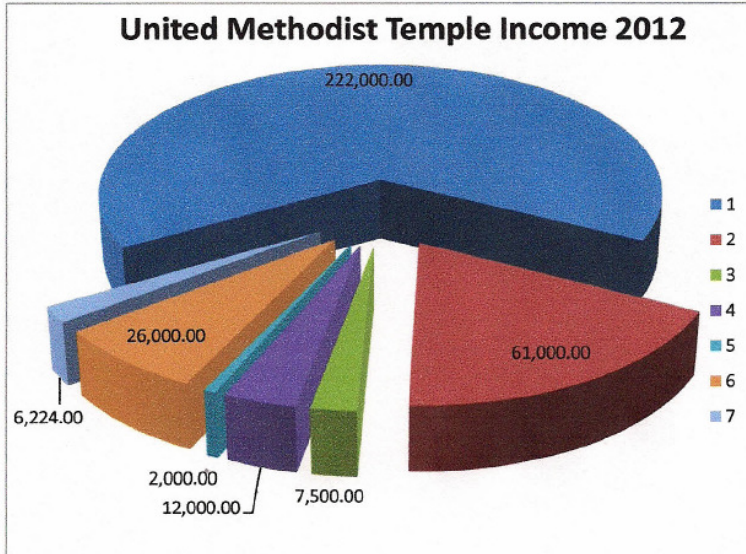
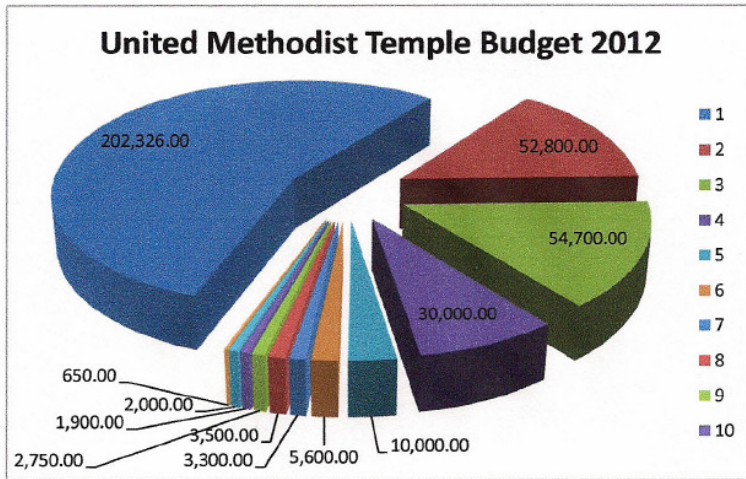
1. **MISSION AND VISION:** The congregation understands that the day this consultation report is accepted (should that be the case), this congregation will adopt, **"to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world"** as its mission statement. A Day of Visioning workshop will be held by May 1, 2012 and a vision will be developed and presented by July 1, 2012. After the adoption of the vision, every ministry in the congregation must show how it will accomplish the mission.
2. **STAFF COMMUNICATION AND CLARIFICATION OF ROLES:** It is the opinion of the consulting team that the staff needs to come together as a team to fulfill the mission and vision of United Methodist Temple. Workshops will be provided for paid and unpaid staff to develop teamwork, redefine roles and responsibilities. Job descriptions and an ongoing evaluation process for all leaders will be developed.
3. **OUTWARD FOCUS:** BY May 1, 2012, an Outward-Focused team will be created to be led by a person with strong leadership skills and a passion for outreach. The team will audit existing outreach events and determine changes that need to be made to reach and minister to the physical and spiritual needs of the community.
4. **COMMUNICATION AND CONNECTION:** By May 1, 2012, a Communication Evaluation Team will be established to evaluate the effectiveness of current communication within the congregation, as well as the community. They will research and explore healthy communication practices of other churches, and present a plan for recommended changes to the Administrative Council on or before September 30, 2012.
5. **DISCIPLESHIP PATHWAY:** By October 1, 2012, the senior pastor, consultation with the coach, will put together a team of three lay leaders to create a clear discipleship path for moving people from where they are on their spiritual journey to becoming a fully devoted follower of Jesus Christ. Additionally, the pastor in consultation with the coach will provide a training process to create the necessary opportunities for entry onto the discipleship path. This new process will be adopted and implemented in the life of United Methodist Temple for all by June 1, 2013.

PROPERTY LEASE OPPORTUNITY BETWEEN UMT AND TERRE HAUTE CHEVROLET

Last fall our neighbor, Terre Haute Chevrolet, approached us about purchasing one (1) acre of our property. This proposal was studied by the Trustee's and the decision was made to **NOT** sell any of the church's property. During our discussion the option of leasing some of our property to Chevrolet was examined. It was felt this could be a good opportunity to provide a new revenue stream for the church while still maintaining the property for future needs as we grow.

What would this type of negotiated agreement (lease) involve and what would it mean to our church? Listed below are some of the key issues that would need to be discussed.

Amount of property to be leased to Terre Haute Chevrolet would be approximately (.7) acres.

We would maintain complete access to our garage.

All improvements to the leased property would be approved by UMT trustees. (Example - pavement, lighting, fencing)

The current children's playground would need to be relocated to the east side of the fellowship hall. Fencing would be installed to insure children's safety.

Cost to relocate children's playground to be negotiated with Terre Haute Chevrolet.

Length of the lease agreement to be negotiated. (5-10-15 years.)

All cost associated with legal requirements for lease agreement, survey, etc. to be negotiated with Terre Haute Chevrolet.

Monthly leasing terms between UMT and Chevrolet for the described acreage to be negotiated.

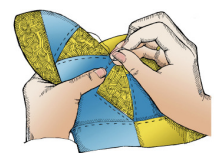
The current parking agreement with Terre Haute Chevrolet to be offered in conjunction with this lease with re-negotiated terms.

If we decide to go forward with this proposal and we are able to reach agreement with Terre Haute Chevrolet it will change our landscape behind the church. The area which is now grass will be paved for vehicle parking. We will have vehicles parked in the negotiated area on a permanent basis for the length of the lease agreement. There will no longer be an area for the garden.

Your Trustees have approved a motion to go forward with this proposal and will be presenting it to the Administrative Council for review and approval in February. We feel this is a good opportunity to utilize some of our unused property to generate some much needed revenues, while still maintaining ownership of the property for future needs.
